As part of School Direct at Transform, you will also be part of an accelerated development and talent management programme that identified your strengths and prepares you to excel in your chosen field.

Structure of Programme

Transform and the University of Nottingham have created an excellent training programme combining school-based practice and academic study. You will spend 4 days per week in school supported by a class mentor. You will gain experience in up to 3 schools and at least 2 different key stages.

On designated 'Transform Thursdays' trainees come together to learn best practice from specialists across our Alliance of schools in areas such as Behaviour Management, SEN, Phonics and Maths.

Fridays are spent with other initial teacher trainees at the University of Nottingham.



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On entry to teacher training you are required to hold:

- A UK degree or equivalent qualification
- Grade C or above in English Language GCSE - needed on application
- Grade C or above in Mathematics GCSE - needed on application
- Grade C or above in Science GCSE - needed on application
- 2 references (one from an employer)
- All applicants should gain experience in a UK school prior to interview.

How to Apply

Stage 1 - UCAS

Apply through UCAS Teacher Training using the 'Apply' system, found on their website at (www.ucas.com/apply/teacher/teacher-training) Candidates begin by registering their details; choosing where, when and how they plan to study (to apply to our School Direct Programme you must enter Sneinton C of E Primary or Transform and use the provider code: 1E4). Once the application has been received and processed by UCAS it is made available online for training providers to consider. Please be aware that we are unable to process your application without references. Therefore we recommend you contact referees to ask that they return the forms as soon as possible so as to not delay your application.

Stage 2 - Screening

The University of Nottingham will review your application and advise you if you are being invited for interview.

Stage 3 - Interviews

The interview stage will take place with the University of Nottingham and Transform. This process has been specifically designed to give you a further opportunity to assess the full benefits for the Transform School Direct Programme.

Stage 4 - Acceptance of offer of a place

If successful at the school based interview, you will be offered a place on the Transform School Direct course. To secure your place you will need to formally accept the place and have passed the Professional Skills tests.

About Transform Teaching School Alliance

The DfE designated Sneinton C of E Primary an outstanding school in 2012. As Transform's lead school, this enabled the development of a primary-led alliance of 50 schools in and around Nottingham and Derby committed to developing and investing in their teachers - the Transform Teaching School Alliance.

Government have asked Teaching Schools to play a fundamental role in developing a national system of teacher training, professional development, coaching and talent management.
